

Chapter 12: Why was the Universe Created?

In the Beginning . . .

I began this book with six difficult and important questions. The first three questions have been answered in the previous chapters. The last three questions are the most important. They are: “Why was the Universe created?” “If God created the Universe, then who created God?” “Why was man created and what is his place in the Universe?” These have to be the most difficult questions in the entire Universe to answer—difficult, but not impossible. If a theory of existence can answer these three questions, it must be the secret of the Universe and how it really works. This chapter WILL answer these three questions.

Summary of what we think we know:

The previous chapters should have proven to you that there is a God in the Universe, who is also called “the Lord of Hosts.” What he “hosts” and builds is the Universe, just as an operating system hosts and controls other programs in a computer. The “computer” which I have named “The Diehold,”¹ holds all the information of our Universe including the Operating System.² Our Diehold has to be constructed out of matter, otherwise information could not be contained within it, to be processed, and transmitted to create our existence. If it is constructed out of matter then the Theory of Multidimensional Reality states that it is transmitted into existence from another Diehold—just not ours but one above ours. I think you can see where I am going with this. If I have presented enough proof that the Universe is the product of information, then it logically leads you to the conclusion that a very highly advanced civilization must have built our Diehold and turned it on. I will refer to them as the “Builders.” The action of turning on our Diehold created our Big Bang, the beginning of our Universe. However, that still does not tell us why they built our Diehold and Man’s purpose, in the scheme of things. To answer that, we must delve deeper.

The Answer is in Genesis

In order to unravel this great mystery of what Man is in relation to the Universe we must start at the beginning, Genesis Chapter 2:8: “And the Lord God planted a garden eastward, in Eden; and there He put the man whom He had formed.”

The Hebrew word for “formed” can also mean *pattern*. So what this verse reveals is that God created a *pattern* that represented man. In other words, He created a *program* that represented man, which the Diehold creates into existence. A program cannot “die” in a computer unless it is destroyed or turned off by the Operating System. Your soul is the program and it does not “die” after your physical body (receptacle) stops functioning.

Our next clue is found in Genesis 2:17: “But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it; for in the day that thou eateth thereof *thou shalt surely die*” [Emphasis added.] The verse implies that Adam’s (Man’s) previous state of existence was to live forever, but if he entered some device, allegorically represented as the “tree of knowledge of good and evil,” Man would then, and only then, be mortal. The same theme is again repeated in Chapter 3:3: “But of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God hath said: ‘Ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, *lest ye die*’ ” [Emphasis added.] The message is loud and clear, these people were in a state of existence that they would live forever.

I have already explained in Chapter 4, on the Hebrew Alphabet, what Adam and Eve did and what they were. They made a conscious decision to de-evolve into fifth dimensional beings, but the Biblical story does not tell us why they did it, and that is the secret you are about to discover.

An Advanced Civilization—The Builders

To avoid confusion, I do not mean the advanced civilization that placed the advanced technology in Abraham’s cave. I am referring to the “Builders” of our Diehold. What kind of civilization could build a computer to replicate their Universe? It would have had to be either a highly advanced fifth dimensional beings or six-dimensional beings who have been around for more time than I am willing to guess. Why would an advanced civilization want to build a replica of their own Diehold that they know they are in? There are two reasons. The first reason is important, but the second reason is the ultimate, paramount reason.

The Simple Reason

The first reason I thought of was the obvious one. The principle of the experiment is: Do you get out what you put into it? There must be a mechanism within the Diehold, which enables the Operating System to report to the “Builders” of the Diehold. I thought of a simple experiment that would prove whether the Operating System permeated all levels of existence. Allow me to explain what I mean. Imagine you are standing between two parallel mirrors. When you look at one, you see yourself reflected an infinite number of times in the two mirrors. Another analogy is taking a computer program and copying it onto a compact disk (CD), loading it into another computer, and then copying the same program
